Exemplary and Engaging Classrooms and Labs

- Students are prepared for more than 235 unique careers in the science, business and technology of agriculture, food and natural resources.
- **2018 WV Teacher of the Year, Katlin Thorsell** is an Agriculture Teacher from Washington High School.
- Three Agriculture courses count for the third lab science credit and one for fine arts credit to meet high school graduation requirement for students.
- Every Agriculture concentration completer receives a **credential from the WV Department of Agriculture**.
- **Innovation and technology** are infused in agriculture curriculum. Students are learning how to solve real-world problems while using the latest technology like drones, GPS and scientific lab equipment and instrumentation.
- **Dual Credit Agriculture courses** are now available at several Community and Technical Colleges in WV.

Experiential Learning through a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE)

- **\$5.5 million** average annual economic impact in WV from student agricultural enterprises
- **Record keeping and financial management skills** taught through the use of a state-wide online record keeping system

Farm Credit of the Virginias and the WV Farm Bureau give both financial and technical support to the FFA. The WVU Extension Small Farm Center sponsors an annual Business Plan competition and the Robert C. Byrd Institute (RCBI) and Eastern Community Technical College sponsors an annual Ag Innovation and Technology Challenge.


The FFA Mission: FFA makes a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success through agricultural education.
